

FOUNDER'S MESSAGE

When something is supposed to happen – it usually does.

It all started in 2018 with a solo bike ride down the California coast to raise support for our son's non-profit clinic: **VIP NeuroRehabilitation Center**. It was simply called "Charbo's Charge" - a Mom and Pop fundraiser.

"Coincidentally" **BUD/S Class 98** held a 40-year reunion only weeks later. Four of my classmates decided they wanted to team up for a 1,000-mile ride to raise more support for VIP. During the planning phase for that 2019 ride, Beyond the Teams was formed. Beyond the Teams successfully raised over \$65,000 for the clinic.

Shifting gears, we decided a paddle would be more indicative of our SEAL heritage, so our next mission would feature a 6-man Hawaiian outrigger canoe. Covid pushed all our 2020 plans to the right. In May, 2021 Beyond the Teams paddled 300-miles from Key West to the Navy SEAL Museum to raise \$100,000 to support the Museum's Trident House Charities Program.

We have 3 missions on the books for 2022. Motivated volunteers; pushing each other to higher levels of fitness and performance; eager to sacrifice time, effort, personal finances in the service of those less fortunate.

Looking back – it's obvious to all of us that this was supposed to happen.

This confirms a longheld conviction instilled in us early in our Naval Special Warfare training:

Retired Navy SEALs reunite for a new type of Mission

NEW BERN, Craven County — Around 2:30 Tuesday afternoon, 5 retired Navy SEALs cycled into the Elks Lodge off Pine Tree Drive in New Bern to take a short rest from their 1,000 mile bicycle ride along the east coast.

The five teammates—Mike Charbonnet, Conrad Kress, Rick Bernard, Patrick Shelton and Diedrick Snelling are biking from Virginia Beach to Fort Pierce Florida in just 10 days. That’s about 100 miles per day. It’s all to raise money & awareness for the VIP NeuroRehabilitation Center in San Diego— a clinic that provides care and therapy for people with spinal cord injuries, MS, Cerebral Palsy and other neurological afflictions.

That clinic has a special place in Mike Charbonnet’s heart.

“My son was a Navy SEAL but in 2011, but he was injured in a parachuting accident. He’s a patient there,” says Charbonnet.

Retired SEALs biking 1,000 miles for the disabled roll into Wilmington

WILMINGTON, N.C. (WECT) — One group of retired military members continue to serve their country, this time by rallying for people who live with disabilities.

Beyond the Teams is a group made up of ex-Navy SEALs who graduated training together.

They’re setting off on a 1,000 mile, 11-day bike ride down the east coast to raise money for people with neuromuscular illnesses and help them regain mobility and have a better quality of life.

The ride will start in Virginia Beach, Va., and finish at the birthplace of Navy Frogmen/SEALS in Ft. Pierce, Fla.

On Wednesday, they arrived in Wilmington with another 100 miles under their belts.

US Navy SEAL Museum

The National Navy SEAL Museum is the only museum dedicated solely to preserving the history of the United States Navy SEALs and their predecessors. Located in Fort Pierce, Florida, the Museum resides on the training grounds of the original Navy combat divers, the Frogmen.

Built to honor the men who served with fortitude and dedication, the Navy SEAL Museum first opened its doors on Veterans Day in 1985. From humble beginnings, the facility has experienced tremendous growth, achieving national stature in 2007.

The main objective of the Museum remains the promotion of public education by providing the opportunity to explore the history of the United States Navy SEALs through interactive exhibits, while honoring the fallen at the Navy SEAL Memorial and caring for those warriors' families through the **Trident House Charities Program.**

The charities include scholarships, a respite house, K-9s, and medical assistance for Navy SEAL veterans and their families.




West Coast & Coast-to-Coast Relay Runs



In the Spring of 2022, Beyond The Teams will conduct a relay run from Santa Barbara, CA. to San Diego, CA. This run is a precursor to a much more ambitious Mission. Funds raised during this West Coast relay will be given in support of **VIP Rehabilitation Center in San Diego, CA.** This center is chartered to rehabilitate people who are working to overcome a variety of physical challenges, to include veterans, children and athletes.

In 2023, in order to celebrate and draw attention to the West Coast planned opening of the SEAL Museum in San Diego, we will conduct a “Torch Run” from Ft. Pierce, FL. to the steps of the new museum in San Diego! Yes, that’s over 3,500 miles! This will also serve as a fundraising event for the Museum’s Charitable foundation, **Trident House Charities** that provides support to the SEAL community to include injured SEALs, the families of SEALs lost in combat and scholarship opportunities for their families.

Baja 1,000 Off-Road Race



Beyond The Teams members are no stranger to challenges. The Baja 1000 represents one the greatest off-road challenges on the planet.

We have already secured the support of some the industry leaders and influencers in Motorcycle racing and look forward to the mutual cooperation and support needed to make this a successful Mission.

We will be teaming with **Hero Racing**, the 2021 50+ Pro Baja 400, 500 & 1,000 winner and 2021 SCORE Racing overall champion for route planning, pits assistance, rider support and logistics. Aj Catanzaro a professional Supercross racer and founder of the “Moto Academy” which is now partnered with the 2021 Outdoor Lucas Oil Pro Motocross 250 Champion, Jett Lawrence will be providing rider development for our Team.

Beyond the Teams Outrigger Challenge & Outreaches



Our 300-Mile Outrigger Canoe Paddle in May 2021 caught the attention of lots of South Florida water enthusiasts. So, for 2022 we will engage the community with weekend-long outreach missions in Key West and Miami. The focus will be on water safety, teamwork, paddling technique, and leadership.

Between the two weekend long outreach events, we'll have a 3-4 day open-ocean paddle from Key West to Miami with clubs from Florida to raise support for ocean paddling in the area and spread the Aloha.

This will not be a race; but it will be a fitness building and friendship building endeavor. The plan is to morph this friendly multi-day paddling "event" into the longest open-ocean outrigger race on the planet – perhaps as early as 2023.
